Universal, affordable and sustainable access to WASH is a key public health issue within international development and is the focus of the first two targets of Sustainable Development Goal 6 (SDG 6). At SDO, we carry out water projects to improve access and quality of water for water stressed and water scarce communities residing all over Sindh, Pakistan.

WATER HAND PUMPS

Small Water Hand Pumps are installed in area where the depth of the well is up to 80 feet, while the Water Hand Large **Pumps** are installed at locations where depths are up to 120 feet. Through the installation of these pumps, the water stressed communities provided an access to water that is near to their homes. Poverty struck communities. that are marginalized are given priority marginalized groups such widows, orphans, disabled persons, etc.

SOLAR WATER PROJECT

In heavily populated water stressed communities, having population of over and around 500 persons, SDO installs solar submersible pumps with storage tanks in order to provide a sustainable source water. Through these interventions, been able to provide SDO has access to water closer to the homes of the beneficiaries, which has saved time of women and children who earlier had to spent hours to fetch water. Through this project, SDO is just not providing water, but is also providing these communities a chance to use this spare time to improve their livelihood and give children's priority to their education.

OTHER PROJECTS

SDO also installs the following water facilities to cover the needs of water scarce and stressed communities:

- Agricultural Tubewells: Through this project a tubewell is prepared to provide water to crops spread over an area of 10 acres, plus cover the drinking water needs of the communities residing near the farmlands.
- Electric Water Coolers: In order to provide cold drinking water, to help people during the summers, the organization installs such water coolers in public places like hospitals, schools and mosques all over Sindh.

FOOD SECURITY PROGRAM

Food security is the measure of the availability of food and individuals' ability to access it. According to the United Nations' Committee on World Food Security, food security is defined as meaning that all people, at all times, have physical, social, and economic access to sufficient, safe, and nutritious food that meets their food preferences and dietary needs for an active and healthy life.

At SDO, we carry out food security program to provide poverty struck and especially disaster struck communities with the provision of food. Through our programs, our teams work around the clock to provide the gift of food security during Ramadan, Eid ul Fitr and Eid ul Adha.

Our food security programs include the following:

- 1. Distribution of Food Ration
- Distribution of Cooked Meals during Ramadan and Disaster
- 3. Qurbani Project

RAMADAN PROJECT

In the holy month of Ramadan, SDO identifies food insecure families in various districts of Sindh to provide them with food ration that would help them with enough food to have decent meals at Suhoor and Iftar. from the Apart that, organization also prepares hot meals during the holy month to provide Iftar meals at locations where people are in need of food and cannot cook – such as hospitals, markets, bus stations, etc.

QURBANI PROJECT

At Eid ul Adha, SDO carries out its Qurbani Project in order to provide meat packages to families belonging to the vulnerable segment of the society i.e. the poor, the needy, the poverty and disaster struck. The teams work round the clock during Eid that the meat to ensure packages reaches to the deserving communities, especially those suffering from nutritional issues. It also provides the donors the opportunity to send their donations to those who really deserve their support, care and attention.

Opinion
